

#### A Concession For Passover

Hunter College High School is a prestigious middle and high school in Manhattan. It is a coveted destination for many New York City students, including Jews.

But is also incredibly difficult to get into. Indeed, even getting to write its three-hour entrance exam is by invitation only and open only to students whose scores on state exams in English and math exceed a high threshold. Nor can a student get into the school after the seventh grade.

This year's entrance exam was scheduled for April 5th, the morning of

the first Seder. Erica Rahavy's son was invited to take the test but was dismayed that the school did not seem to understand that Jews "travel to be with their families on the holidays." have no problem missing the day of school for my kids", she said. "We've done that before to celebrate holidays with our families. It shouldn't be so high-stakes that it's just one day or nothing."

Rahavy sent an email to the school asking if administrators would offer "alternate time for students celebrating the holiday."

Hunter College responded tersely: "The Entrance Exam will only be held on Wednesday April 5, 2023 in the morning and students will have about

three hours to complete the exam. HCCS is unable to administer make-up exams."

But the school, knowing that New York city school are obliged to show sensitivity to religious observance, had a change of heart. Its website announced that "an alternate test date for religious observance on Tuesday afternoon, April 4, 2023, held at Hunter College, will be made available on request."

Rahavy believes that accommodating a widely observed Jewish holiday in New York, where Jews make up more than 10% of the population, was the only course of action Hunter could take. "I can't imagine they would have planned this out on Christmas Eve when families travel to be

with each other for the holidays," she said.

### Escaped Ukraine - Died in Turkey

Yulia Petrova and her two sons, 10-year-old Zachar and 5-year-old Matthew, managed to escape from war torn Ukraine less than a year ago. The Jewish family fled to Turkey.

The bodies of Petrova and her two sons were found buried under the ruins in Antakya, the southermost province of Turkey. They were among the thousands of victims of the devastating earthquake which ravaged the country.

### REFLECTIONS ON PASSOVER

The spirit of Passover is the spirit of optimism. It is our assurance that whatever Jewry may have suffered, whatever Jewry may suffer in the future, it has still the power to rise above the agony of the present and work towards a future in which not Jews alone but all peoples may share the four freedoms enunciated by President Roosevelt - freedom of speech, freedom of worship, freedom from want and freedom from fear.

Passover does, indeed, mark a turning point in Jewish history. During the three hundred years in which the Israelites suffered the stinging lash of the Egyptian whip they were hammered on the anvil of oppression and suffering into a people. This people struggled, as so many peoples have struggled over the past centuries, for self-determination, for the right to satisfy its own spiritual and religious aspirations. Finally, under the guidance of Moses, probably the greatest personality the world has ever known, our ancient ancestors emerged out of their Egyptian ghetto and began their first faltering steps towards the fulfillment of what has turned out be a historic purpose.

But Passover has a meaning which goes beyond the historic and philosophical. Its observance creates a radiance and warmth which is unique in the Jewish tradition. Our recollections of Seders past are among the most tender and most heart-warming memories many of us have. The Passover ritual has meaning which even the most rationalistic secularists are able to grasp. It has a beauty which no other aspect of Jewish life, even a synagogue service, can begin to match. Jewish life is, indeed, seen at its finest and most beautiful from the vantage point of a seat at the Passover table and in the stirrings of memories, ancient and new.

# COMBATTING ANTISEMITISM IN PROFESSIONAL DISCIPLINES

CAEF IS A LEADER IN THE FIGHT TO STAMP OUT DISCRIMINATION

Through education, interfaith relations, and advocacy, the Canadian Anti-Semitism Education Foundation (CAEF) equips people with the necessary tools to counter acts of anti-Semitism and the duplicitous manifestations that it stokes, such as myths and tropes against the Jewish people. They respond to issues that affect Jews and Israel, encourage understanding between faiths and cultures, and inform people about the legal claims and rights of the Jews to the land of Israel.

Working with allies and building partnerships in all communities who respect freedom of speech, freedom of religion, the rule of law, and the rights of everyone in Canada under the Charter of Rights and Freedoms, CAEF fights oppresOri Belmont is a freelance writer based in Toronto Visit his website: OriBelmont.com

sion, discrimination, racism, and anti-Semitism in a host of forums and arenas. The uncompromising belief that a community's strength lies in working together with groups of a similar disposition has guided the CAEF through the challenging and murky waters of fighting injustice and hatred.

History has taught us that initially, hateful rhetoric and violence may only be levied against the Jews, but it frequently morphs and proliferates into a broader campaign against other groups.

CAEF promotes adoption of the International Holocaust Remembrance alliance definition of anti-Semitism. "We combat anti-Semitism that mas-

querades as anti-Zionism, the latest and most prolific form of Jew hatred. Our projects include research, education, public awareness, interfaith alliances, and advocacy," says Andria Spindel, executive director at CAEF.

President Anita Bromberg represents CAEF on a coalition of religious groups. Among other pursuits, she is Executive Director of the Canadian Race Relations Foundation, overseeing initiatives that bring communities together to combat racism and hate.

CAEF has partnered with Doctors Against Racism

and Antisemitism, Hasbara Fellowships Canada, StandWithUs Canada and the Alpha Omega International Dental Society to embark on the 'Hineni' project. They are collaborating with Annette Poizner, research director, MSW, Ed.D. RSW and Stacey Love, Re-Assistant, search 'Hineni' translates to "here I am," and is the response Avraham gives when asked to sacrifice his son Yitzhak. Also, the term refers to the humility we espouse as we present ourselves on the Yanim Noraim (days of awe) for judgement by the almighty. Likewise, the

# WHY OHIO TOWN IS NAMED EAST PALESTINE

MANY AMERICAN TOWNS HAVE BIBLICAL NAMES

A toxic spill has drawn the nation's attention to the little town of East Palestine, Ohio, just as another tragedy, the explosion of the space shuttle Columbia in 2003, turned the nation's gaze upon the town of Palestine, Texas, where much of the debris landed.

why it has such as unusual name. The answer is that it's not a very unusual name at all.

Elsewhere in Ohio, there are towns named Hebron, Gilboa, Canaan, and Shiloh (two of them, in fact). There's even a Sodom, which was given its name after a prohibition advocate, disappointed at the small turnout for his lecture in 1840, jokingly compared the locale to that infamous biblical center of sin.

In Texas, in addition to Palestine, there are towns with the names

Hebbronville and Joshua. There is a Hebron in North Dakota and a Sinai in South Dakota, a Jerusalem in Arkansas, a Jericho in Vermont, a Bethlehem as well as a Nazareth in Pennsylvania, and a Zion in Maryland. Nearly every state has one or more towns named after biblical sites or individuals. Altogether, there are more than 1,000 biblically-named towns from

# LIMMUD TORONTO RETURNS TO DOWNTOWN!

TORONTO'S PREMIER FESTIVAL OF JEWISH LEARNING RETURNS TO AN IN-PERSON INTERACTIVE FORMAT -BUT "HYBRID" MODEL KEEPS TIES WITH REMOTE AUDIENCES

After two successful virtual "Zoom" events, Limmud Toronto returns to its in-person format for April 30, 2023. Limmud, which can be translated as "learning," is an innovative, inclusive festival that celebrates Jewish discussions and ideas. It's an immersive, multidisciplinary day of performances, lectures, debates and workshops. With a marketplace, entertainment, a catered lunch, and special programming for participants aged 5-12, Limmud Toronto aspires to offer something to everyone. "We're delighted to

return to a live festival and the atmosphere of celebration and community that we get from being face-to-face," says Mira Kates Rose, this year's Co-Chair. "Organizing a festival where we can see people striking up conversations, making friends, swapping stories about what they've just learned or started to wonder about - those connections are such a vital part of Limmud, so it's nice to have the energy that comes from this format. But we're definitely keeping some features that grew out of our online events, which had participants and volunteers joining us from Ukraine, Israel, South Africa, Jamaica and Gravenhurst. 'Hineni' project presents itself in a similarly conscientious manner, seeking to identify, expose, and investigate anti-Semitism at post-secondary institutions, where the toxicity of anti-Jewish attitudes and behaviours has become all too familiar.


The study demonstrates that some students currently enrolled in social work education are contending with blatant anti-Semitism. The report's findings reveal that both nuanced and overt instances of anti-Semitism are common, if not ubiquitous within the discipline. Poizner feels that at a minimum, the field must intethe study grate anti-Semitism into both the social work curriculum and Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI). Although the post-secondary curriculum has yet to see tangible change, social work entities are at least beginning to

take note.

"We appreciate that the Ontario professional bodies are now working to self-correct. Nevertheless, we await signs of change from the individual schools where the worst of the problems have been reported," says Poizner.

Ms. Poizner is optimistic about bringing these findings forward. By bringing these issues to light, she remains confident that the necessary changes can occur. But left unchecked, this markedly deviant modus operandi will surely continue.

The thematic essence of 'Stronger Together Fighting to End Jew Hatred' is at the crux of CAEF's mission. 

One recent event, 'Israel: The Good Neighbour, Not an Apartheid State', presented by CAEF and CILR (Canadians for Israel's Legal Rights) took place at the Lodzer Centre. The keynote speaker was LTC (Ret.) Eval Dror, who served as an officer in the IDF in a variety of positions. Dror founded and served as the commander of the 'Good Neighbour' unit, an entity which in collaboration with non-governmental organizations of all faiths, executed 700 humanitarian missions to Syrian civilians in the border area. He dispelled the myth of Israeli being an apartheid country, an obvious lie which invariably emboldens Jew-haters as this rhetoric increasingly becomes a part of the mainstream.



February 5th, and at 4am the disaster struck," Yulia's father, Sergey Petrov, said. "I lost touch with them then."

Yulia's husband is a solder in the Ukrainian army and is in hospital recovering from wounds suffered during the fighting.

Estimates of the number of Jews in Ukraine vary but Hebrew demographer Sergio Della Pergola's says that Ukraine is home to between 56,000 and 140,000 Jews, making it the fourth largest Jewish community in Europe and the eleventh largest in the world.

#### Moroccan Textbooks Embrace Jewish Life


A report conducted by the Israeli-British organization IMPACT-se that analyzes schoolbooks and curricula for compliance with UNESCO-defined standards on peace and tolerance, in collaboration with the Jeffrey M. Talpins Foundation and its president Oren Eisner, concluded that textbooks in Moroccan schools embrace Jewish life and that Jews are entwined in the national and cultural fabric of Morocco. The study examined 127 textbooks in state-run schools emphasizing social studies. history, Islamic studies, language and literature.

"We want to thank the Kingdom of Morocco for taking steps to improve its curriculum and spread tolerance and understanding throughout the Middle East", said Eisner. The report noted that reforms were meant to familiarize students with Jews and Judaism "to a far greater extent than other curricula we have reviewed.". Students now know that the Jewish

community is an "inseparable part" of Morocco, it continued.

Added IMPACT-se CEO Marcus Sheff: "We are struck by this unique embrace of Jews and Judaism in the reformed Moroccan school curriculum. The affection through which Morocco's Jewish community and its customs are represented as well as the lives of individual Moroccan Jews is heart-warming."

The report did conclude that one area of the curriculum still needs attention. The Holocaust is not taught in schools and

while a two -state solution to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict is endorsed, there is obvious sympathy for the Palestinian side.

Morocco is home to some 2000 Jews.

two last place finishes and the departure of several high profile players to free agency. The successful playoff run in 2021 has long been forgotten by fans used to winning seasons.

coast to coast.

Towns such as East Palestine, Ohio, were established by 19th-century religious Christian settlers; they chose those names to express their spiritual attachment to the land and people of the Bible. When they thought of Palestine, they recalled the Jewish kingdoms and temples of ancient times, as well as the events surrounding the origins of Christianity in the Jewish town of Bethlehem. their prayers, they prayed for the return of the Jews to the Holy Land, which they understood to be inextricably linked to the coming messianic age.

The area that became East Palestine was originally known as Mechanicsburg. There are a number of towns in the U.S. that were originally settled

by mechanics of various types. But in the case of Ohio, "Mechanicsburg" was changed in 1836 becauseaccording to an early history of the region—"the wife of Dr. Robert Chamberlin desired a more euphonious appellation and desired it [be] called 'Palestine,' the quiet beauty of the little town, and the earnest, virtuous, simple life of its people suggesting to her a name recalling holy memories."

Since there already was a town named "Palestine" in the western part of the state—likewise founded by religious Christians who wanted to infuse their town with "holy memories"—government officials, in assigning the new post office, added the prefix "East."

That early account of East Palestine's founding

was published in 1905, when it was common for a married woman's name to be hidden behind that of her husband. But a historical marker in front of the log house where the Chamberlins once lived tells us that the name of the doc-

tor's wife was Rebecca—an appropriately biblical name for a woman who took her Bible seriously.

Not surprisingly, numerous churches quickly sprung up in East Palestine and its environs. Lutheran and Reformed congregations established the Salem Church, choosing a name derived from "Jerusalem." Evangelical Lutherans founded the St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church, while Methodists originally held their services in a local school-the separation between church and state was still rather fuzzy in those days-before eventually erecting their Methodist Episcopal Church. East Palestine also had a United Presbyterian Church and, later, another house of worship with a biblically-inspired name, the Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church.

When America's religious Christian settlers thought of the Holy Land, they thought of the Hebrew bible and the area's 3,000 years of Jewish inhabitation, not the Koran or the more recently-arrived Arab

residents of the area. They thought of the many Jews who appear in the accounts of the birth of Christianity (including its founder), texts that do not mention any Palestinian Arabs.

Certainly Americans were aware that there were Arabs living in Palestine in the 19th century. Mark Twain, for example, had mentioned them in his account of his (Please turn to following page)

visit to the Holy Land, The Innocents Abroad (1869). So had Herman Melville in his famous Clarel: A Poem and the Pilgrimage in the Holy Land (1876).

But it was common knowledge that the Arab population of Palestine was relatively small and unsettled, and that the Arab residents of 19th-century Palestine regarded themselves as part of southern Syria, not as a separate nationality. H. Allen Tupper, Jr. wrote in the *New York Times* in 1896, after having "ridden on horseback more than four hundred miles through Palestine and Syria," that virtually the only local people he encountered were "merchantmen"

men with their long camel trains" and "wild Bedouin tribes" that "reside in one locality not more than two months."

Today's residents pronounce East Palestine "Palesteen," but the original settlers undoubtedly pronounced it the more common way. Because it was the Holy Land, with its deep Jewish roots, that burned

bright in the hearts and prayers of the founders of the many biblically-named towns across America. And it is for the same reason that Bible-believing Christians today—probably including more than a few residents of East Palestine, Ohio—constitute one of the major sources of pro-Israel sentiment in the United States.

Bloom is a Jewish day school graduate, observes shabbat and keeps a kosher home. During his 15 years with the Tampa Bay Rays prior to joining the Red Sox Bloom and his family lived close to Tropicana Field so he could walk to home games on Friday nights.

#### Saying "No" To Roger Waters

Roger Waters, the bassist for Pink Floyd, is a persistent critic of Israel. He is at the forefront of the BDS movement and is constantly spreading anti Semites tropes.

Waters was scheduled to perform on May 28th at Frankfurt, Germany's Festhalle. Festhalle was the site of the deportation of 3000 Jews to their deaths just after Kristallnacht.

The city of Frankfurt is part owner of the concert hall and announced that it was cancelling the planned concert. "The background to the cancelation is the persistent anti-Israel behaviour of the former Pink Floyd frontman, who is considered one of the most widely spread antisemites of the world," the city said in a statement. "He repeatedly called for a cultural boycott of Israel and drew comparisons to the apartheid regime of South Africa and put pressure on artists to cancel events in Israel."
